

Mark Your Calendar: Woodward, lowa, Elections on November 4, 2025

The City of Woodward and the Woodward-Granger School District will hold important elections on Tuesday, November 4, 2025. Registered voters are strongly encouraged to participate in the election. Local elections provide an essential opportunity for residents to shape the policies and leadership that impact the community and schools. Every vote matters, and your participation ensures that your voice is heard.

For the Woodward City Council, voters will choose from five candidates (voting to fill three seats) vying to represent the community: Jim Gough (Incumbent), Steve Godwin (Incumbent), Dr. Victor Kersey, Tyler Randall, and Kelly Kirts. City council members play a critical role in setting policies, approving budgets, and guiding the direction of community development, public services, and local initiatives. Each candidate brings their unique experience, vision, and priorities for Woodward, giving voters the chance to select representatives who align with their values and hopes for the future.

The Woodward-Granger School Board elections will also be held on November 4, with seats available in multiple areas of the district. For the At-Large position, Ashley Brandt is running. Voters in District 1 will choose between David Elliott and Eric Polich, while Troy Janssen is running for the District 2 seat. School board members are responsible for overseeing the district's policies, educational programs, and budget decisions, all of which directly affect students, teachers, and families. By voting in these elections, residents help ensure that the school district's leadership reflects the

community's educational priorities and values.

Participating in local elections is a meaningful way to engage with your community. Unlike national elections, local votes directly influence decisions that affect daily life in Woodward, from infrastructure projects to school programs and community services. Being informed about the candidates and their platforms allows voters to make thoughtful decisions that will benefit both the city and the school district.

The November 4th elections present an important opportunity to have a direct impact on the leadership and future of Woodward and the Woodward-Granger School District. By clicking onto the Library's website, locate the Adventure Pass, next choose the venue you would like to visit and the day you wish to attend, and enter your card number. You are then able to print your pass. Take this pass with you with a picture ID. You will be able to attend and take your family free of charge. One may visit each of these five places once per year.
